this report reviews the methods used to estimate the national number of people eligible to participate in the special supplemental nutrition program for women infants and children wic under full funding of the program it reviews alternative data sets and methods for estimating income eligibility adjunctive eligibility which occurs when people are eligible for wic because they are enrolled in other federal public assistance programs and nutritional risk as well as for estimating participation if the program is fully funded

## **Estimating Eligibility and Participation for the WIC Program 2003-09-15**

each year the u s department of agriculture usda must estimate the number of people who are eligible to participate in the special supplemental nutrition program for women infants and children wic these usda estimates have come under critical scrutiny in part because the number of infants and postpartum women who have actually enrolled in the program has exceeded the number estimated to be eligible by as much as 20 to 30 percent these high coverage rates have led some members of congress to conclude that some people who participate are truly ineligible and that funding could be reduced somewhat and still meet the needs of truly eligible persons who wish to participate but some advocates and state wic agencies believe that the estimates of the number of eligible persons are too low and more people who are eligible and want to participate could do so in response to these concerns the food and nutrition service fns of the usda asked the committee on national statistics of the national research council to convene a panel of experts to review the methods used to estimate the number of people nationwide who are eligible and likely to participate in the wic program the panel s charge is to review currently used and alternative data and methods for estimating income eligibility adjunctive eligibility from participation in other public assistance programs nutritional risk and participation if the program is fully funded

the mission of the special supplemental nutrition program for women infants and children wic is to safeguard the health of low income women infants and children through age 4 who are at nutritional risk wic provides nutritious foods to supplement diets nutrition education and referrals to health care and other social services almost half of all infants and about a quarter of all children ages 1 4 in the u s participate in the program wic accounts for 10 of total federal spending on food and nutrition assistance this report describes the wic program how it works its history program trends and the characteristics of the population it serves it also examines

current issues facing wic focusing mainly on those with important economic implications

from the introduction this volume presents 103 options that would decrease federal spending or increase federal revenues over the next decade those options cover many areas ranging from defense to energy social security and provisions of the tax code the budgetary effects identified for most of the options span the 10 years from 2014 to 2023 the period covered by cbo's may 2013 baseline budget projections although many of the options would have longer term effects as well chapters 2 through 5 present options in the following categories chapter 2 mandatory spending other than that for health related programs chapter 3 discretionary spending other than that for health related programs chapter 4 revenues other than those related to health chapter 5 health related programs and revenue provisions in addition to 11 options that are similar in scope to others in this volume chapter 5 includes 5 broad approaches for reducing spending on health care programs or revenues forgone because of tax provisions related to health care each would offer lawmakers a variety of possibilities for making changes in current laws chapter 6 differs from the rest of the volume it discusses the challenges and the potential budgetary effects of eliminating a cabinet department

usda s special supplemental nutrition program for women infants and children wic provides nutritious foods nutrition counseling and referrals to health and other social services to low income women and their infants children up to age 5 despite the health benefits of wic participation many eligible women do not participate during pregnancy and many households exit wic when a participating child turns 1 year old the authors of this report use the first two waves of the early childhood longitudinal study birth cohort ecls b to understand these transitions into and out of wic findings show that households that are more economically advantaged are more likely to delay entry into the program or exit after a child turns 1 year old some of the mothers exiting the program reported that wic requires too much effort and that its benefits are not worth the time 26.2 percent of those exiting or that they have scheduling and transportation problems almost 10 percent of those exiting suggesting that the costs of participation may be a barrier to continued wic participation

the national school lunch program and the school breakfast program administered by the food and nutrition service of the u s department of agriculture usda are key components of the nation s food security safety net providing free or low cost meals to millions of school age children each day under the most commonly adopted provisions usda reimburses districts for meals served on the basis of data collected in a base year during which applications are taken after 3 or 4 years applications must be taken again to establish new base year data unless the district provides evidence that local conditions have not changed a special provision that does not require applications to be taken every few years would reduce burden be more attractive to school districts and potentially increase student participation by expanding access to free meals to support the development of such a provision the food and nutrition service asked the national academies to study the technical and operational issues that arise in using data from the american community survey acs a new continuous survey replacing the long form survey of the decennial census to obtain estimates of students who are eligible for free and reduced price meals for schools and school districts such estimates would be used to develop claiming percentages that if sufficiently accurate would determine federal reimbursements to districts for the schools that provide free meals to all students under a new special provision that eliminates the base year requirements of current provisions
