looks at the opportunities and challenges facing school teachers as they set about implementing the changes of the 1988 education reform act it analyzes relevant research places the theory within the sociological political and educational contexts and identifies future questions and issues this book presents thirty one accounts by final year pre service teachers providing guidance and insights for less advanced teacher education students and illustrating the use of life history and narrative stories as methods for pre service teachers to explore educational issues in classroom practice this life history approach identifies those political economic and social forces that have impinged on the individual at different points in their life and contributed to the process of changing their identities these stories are not written by established specialists in the areas they deal with but instead by novice teachers at the beginning of their paths towards mastering the intricacies of teaching and learning in school settings as such the book provides a mentoring framework and a means of helping pre service teachers share their valuable experiences and insights into aspects such as how to manage practicum requirements it helps establish a supportive relationship among pre service teachers providing them with access to valuable peer experiences in addition it helps pre service teachers make sense of their own practicum experiences and reflect on their own beliefs and professional judgement to develop their approaches and solve problems in their own classroom practice in the past schools have labelled the most able students in a class or year group as gifted and talented while segregating these students may help them to achieve their academic potential there is little benefit in this practice for their less able classmates even less so for those who are left in the middle space identified as neither highly academic nor severely struggling the stretch and challenge model focuses on setting high expectations for all students regardless of their ability encouraging all children to meet universally high targets introduces flexibility between otherwise rigid ability groups and gives children greater opportunities to exceed split into two parts stretch and challenge focuses on different ways of thinking about and implementing this model in school debbie light begins by helping teachers to create a culture of high expectations in their classroom by setting challenging learning objectives creating opportunities for students to develop independence and supporting students as they become resilient learners the second half of the book advises teachers how to create an inclusive learning environment where all children feel challenged by encouraging teacher questioning designing tasks grouping students and effectively using teaching assistants filled with honest experienced and undeniably helpful advice debbie light s stretch and challenge is a must have guide for all teachers who want to collectively maximise their students learning and achievement the book provides a set of ready to use training plans to help you train your colleagues and is accompanied by powerpoint slides available to download online for free it offers 19 hours of cpd equating to a cost
