as seen on bbc s winterwatch with chris packham and michaela strachan the finest book ever written on nature and landscape in britain guardian in this masterpiece of nature writing nan shepherd describes her journeys into the cairngorm mountains of scotland there she encounters a world that can be breathtakingly beautiful at times and shockingly harsh at others her intense poetic prose explores and records the rocks rivers creatures and hidden aspects of this remarkable landscape shepherd spent a lifetime in search of the essential nature of the cairngorms her quest led her to write this classic meditation on the magnificence of mountains and on our imaginative relationship with the wild world around us composed during the second world war the manuscript of the living mountain lay untouched for more than thirty years before it was finally published edited and introductions by roderick watson the quarry wood although published well before sunset song inhabits a similar world the progress of its heroine could almost be the alternative story of a chris guthrie who did go to university compassionate and humorous the grace and style of shepherd s prose is heightened by a superb ear for the vigorous language of the north east the weatherhouse shepherd s masterpiece is an even more substantial achievement which belongs to the great line of scottish fiction dealing with the complex interactions of small communities and especially the community of women a touching and hilarious network of mothers daughters spinsters and widows it is also a striking meditation on the nature of truth the power of human longing and the mystery of being the third and final novel a pass in the grampians describes jenny kilgour s coming of age as she has to choose between the kindly harshness of her grandfather s life on a remote hill farm and the vulgar and glorious energy of bella cassie a local girl who left the community to pursue success as a singer and has now returned to scandalise them all the living mountain is a lyrical testament in praise of the cairngorms it is a work deeply rooted in shepherd s knowledge of the natural world and a poetic and philosophical meditation on our longing for high and holy places this is the first omnibus edition of shepherd s prose works her sensitivity and powers of observation raise her work far above the status of regional literature and into the front rank of scottish writing hill walking was shepherd s great love her single collection of poetry in the cairngorms expresses an intensity of deep kinship with nature they are poems written with the perception of one who has climbed the mountains and truly knows them when martha accepts a place at university her decision is met with a mixture of hostility and pride by her uncomprehending family this is the story of a young woman s journey to maturity and independence struggling to cope with the intellectual and emotional challenges that surround her at a time when such space was rarely given freely to women in the quarry wood nan shepherd s subtle prose is matched by intense and memorable descriptions of the natural world and a dry sense of humour ninety years after its first publication it remains as fresh and original today the women of the tiny town of fetter rothnie have grown used to a life without men and none more so than the tangle of mothers and daughters spinsters and widows living at the weatherhouse returned from war with shellshock garry forbes is drawn into their circle as he struggles to build a new understanding of the world from the ruins of his grief in the weatherhouse nan shepherd paints an exquisite portrait of a community coming to terms with the brutal losses of war and the small tragedies yearnings and delusions that make up a life the beginning what do you do when you discover information that is before its time what do you do when your curiosity takes you on an adventure that is so bizarre that there is nothing normal to relate to this is what happened to dolores cannon in 1968 long before she began her career as a past life hypnotherapist and regressionist travel back with us to that time when the words reincarnation past lives regression walk ins new age were unknown to the general population this is the story of two normal people who accidentally stumbled across past lives while working with a doctor to help a patient relax it began so innocently yet it crossed the boundaries of the imagination to open up an entirely new way of thinking at a time when such a thing was unheard of it went totally against the belief systems of the time it was so startling that they should have stopped but their curiosity demanded that they continue to explore the unorthodox the experiment changed the participants and everyone involved and the benefits

would never be the same dolores cannon is now a world renowned hypnotherapist who has explored thousands of cases in the forty years since 1968 and has written fifteen books about her discoveries her books are translated into more than 20 languages she is teaching her unique form of hypnosis all over the world when she lectures people ask how did you get started on all of this this is the story of her beginnings the book was written in 1980 her very first book it has laid dormant gathering dust until now waiting now is the time for it to come forth enjoy the adventure in the 1930s the writer and poet nan shepherd was one of north east scotland s best known literati her image now graces the new scottish 5 note the living mountain has become a classic and sells in its thousands nan shepherd lived all her life in deeside yet few people even in scotland seem to have heard of her but then indifferent to celebrity nan shepherd had a talent for silence long overdue this first biography unravels some of the mysteries dispels some of the rumours and gives insight into the life and work of this perceptive and intensely private woman fhggg dhddd fhgf fhhb remarkable robert macfarlane gorgeous amy liptrout urgent and nourishing jessica j lee nina mingya powles first learned to swim in borneo where her mother was born and her grandfather studied freshwater fish there the local swimming pool became her first body of water through her life there have been others that have meant different things but have still been in their own way home from the wild coastline of new zealand to a pond in northwest london in lyrical powerful prose small bodies of water weaves together memories dreams and nature writing exploring everything from migration food family earthquakes and the ancient lunisolar calendar nina reflects on a girlhood spent growing up between two cultures and what it means to belong a homage to a remarkable poet and his world at the loch of green corrie is more than merely elegant more than a collection of albeit fascinating insights laugh out loud observations and impressively broad erudition sunday herald you could easily make a case that andrew greig has the greatest range of any living scottish writer scotsman for many years andrew greig saw the poet norman maccaig as a father figure months before his death maccaig s enigmatic final request to greig was that he fish for him at the loch of the green corrie the location even the real name of his destination was more mysterious still his search took in days of outdoor living meetings and fishing with friends in the remote hill lochs of far north west scotland it led finally to the waters of the green corrie which would come to reflect greig s own life his thoughts on poetry geology and land ownership in the highlands and the ambiguous roles of whisky love and male friendship at the loch of the green corrie is a richly atmospheric narrative a celebration of losing and recovering oneself many blurbs but my absolute darling absolutely is one stephen king a brilliant and immersive all consuming read about one fourteen year old girl s heart stopping fight for her own soul turtle alveston is a survivor at fourteen she roams the woods along the northern california coast the creeks tide pools and rocky islands are her haunts and her hiding grounds and she is known to wander for miles but while her physical world is expansive her personal one is small and treacherous turtle has grown up isolated since the death of her mother in the thrall of her tortured and charismatic father martin her social existence is confined to the middle school where she fends off the interest of anyone student or teacher who might penetrate her shell and to her life with her father then turtle meets jacob a high school boy who tells jokes lives in a big clean house and looks at turtle as if she is the sunrise and for the first time the larger world begins to come into focus her life with martin is neither safe nor sustainable motivated by her first experience with real friendship and a teenage crush turtle starts to imagine escape using the very survival skills her father devoted himself to teaching her what follows is a harrowing story of bravery and redemption with turtle s escalating acts of physical and emotional courage the reader watches heart in throat as this teenage girl struggles to become her own hero and in the process becomes ours as well shot through with striking language in a fierce natural setting my absolute darling is an urgently told profoundly moving read that marks the debut of an extraordinary new writer it will come as a

shepherd's growing following that there is a body of her work which has never been published in book form and indeed will be entirely unknown outside a very small circle the editor of this volume charlotte peacock found many of these gems when researching for the nan shepherd biography into the mountain published by galileo in 2017 the pieces that peacock found include a brilliant and moving 10 000 word short story descent from the cross a series of field writings which were written at the same time and in the same style as the living mountain 15 poems never seen before a highly entertaining piece on the poetry of hugh macdiarmid and from where the title of this collection arises a haunting description of wild geese in glen callater a version of which also went into the living mountain dolores has accumulated information about the death experience and what lies beyond through 16 years of hypnotic research and past life therapy while retrieving past life experiences that spend the winter hunting the huge flocks of pigeons and waders that share the desolate landscape with them including original diaries from which the peregrine was written and its companion volume the hill of summer this is a beautiful compendium of lyrical nature writing at its absolute best such luminaries as richard mabey robert macfarlane ted hughes and andrew motion have cited this as one of the most important books in 20th century nature writing and the bestselling author mark cocker has provided an introduction on the importance of baker his writings and the diaries creating the essential volume of baker s writings since the hardback was published in 2010 papers maps and letters have come to light which in turn provide a little more background into j a baker s history contemporaries particularly from while he was at school in chelmsford have kindly provided insights remembering a school friend who clearly made an impact on his generation in the longer term there is hope of an archive of these papers being established but in the meantime and with the arrival of this paper

to reveal a little more of what has been learned among fragments of letters to baker was one from a reader who praised a piece that baker had written in rspb birds magazine in 1971 apart from a paper on peregrines which baker wrote for the essex bird report this article entitled on the essex coast appears to be his only other published piece of writing and with the kind agreement of the rspb it has been included in this updated new paperback edition of baker s astounding work shortlisted for the samuel johnson prize 2015 shortlisted for the wainwright prize 2016 landmarks is robert edited and introductions by roderick watson the quarry wood although published well before sunset song inhabits a similar world the progress of its heroine could almost be the alternative story of a chris guthrie who did go to university compassionate and humorous the grace and style of shepherd s prose is heightened by a superb ear for the vigorous language of the north east the weatherhouse shepherd s masterpiece is an even more substantial achievement which belongs to the great line of scottish fiction dealing with the complex interactions of small communities and especially the community of women a touching and hilarious network of mothers daughters spinsters and widows it is also a striking meditation on the nature of truth the power of human longing and the mystery of being the third and final novel a pass in the grampians describes jenny kilgour s coming of age as she has to choose between the kindly harshness of her grandfather s life on a remote hill farm and the vulgar and glorious energy of bella cassie a local girl who left the community to pursue success as a singer and has now returned to scandalise them all the living mountain is a lyrical testament in praise of the cairngorms it is a work deeply rooted in shepherd s knowledge of the natural world and a poetic and philosophical meditation on our longing for high and holy places this is the first omnibus edition of shepherd s prose works her sensitivity and powers of observation raise her work far above the status of regional literature and into the front rank of scottish writing
