Famous American Fortunes and the Men who Have Made Them 2012-09-11 before the 99 occupied wall street before the concept of social justice had impinged on the social conscience before the social safety net had even been conceived by the turn of the 20th century the era of the robber barons andrew carnegie 1835 1919 had already accumulated a staggeringly large fortune he was one of the wealthiest people on the globe he guaranteed his position as one of the wealthiest men ever when he sold his steel business to create the united states steel corporation following that sale he spent his last 18 years he gave away nearly 90 of his fortune to charities foundations and universities his charitable efforts actually started far earlier at the age of 33 he wrote a memo to himself noting the amassing of wealth is one of the worse species of idolatry no idol more debasing than the worship of money in 1881 he gave a library to his hometown of dunfermline scotland in 1889 he spelled out his belief that the rich should use their wealth to help enrich society in an article called the gospel of wealth this book carnegie writes that the best way of dealing with wealth inequality is for the wealthy to redistribute their surplus means in a responsible and thoughtful manner arguing that surplus wealth produces the greatest net benefit to society when it is administered carefully by the wealthy he also argues against extravagance irresponsible spending or self indulgence instead promoting the administration of capital during one s lifetime toward the cause of reducing the stratification between the rich and poor though written more than a century ago carnegie s words still ring true today urging a better more equitable world through greater social consciousness
