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development in particular it is shown that the boundary of the domain of the maximal classical development has a singular part where the inverse density of the wave fronts vanishes signalling shock formation the theorems give a detailed description of the geometry of this singular boundary and a detailed analysis of the behavior of the solution there a complete picture of shock formation in three dimensional fluids is thereby obtained the approach is geometric the central concept being that of the acoustical spacetime manifold
