tolkien s literary art less common in tolkien criticism focus on character especially that of tom bombadil in which two different conclusions are reached but characterization is also seen in the light of different literary techniques motifs and symbols a unique contribution examines the place of linguistics in tolkien s literary art employing gricean concepts in an analysis of the lay of the children of húrín and a quite timely essay presents a new interpretation of tolkien s attitude toward the environment especially in the character of tom bombadil in sum this volume covers new ground
